Training for Children's & Human rights mentors



FUTURE VOICE offers young people between the age of 12 to 27 the opportunity to become a Children's /Human rights mentor. The training is completed with one practical assignment.

What happens there?

We learn a lot about what children's and human rights are, how long they are existing, why we make differences between children's rights and human rights, how these rights are implemented in Germany and around the world, and about their significance for democracy.

Then you are asked: Which rights are particularly important to you and why? What do you think about these rights, why do you want to fight for them? Following you develop with our help texts / pictures and small lectures to your selected rights. We also practice together, how to present these rights to a group.

Our workshops are limited to 8 participants, so that there is enough time and attention for everyone. And we work in different age groups so you can work with peers with similar interests.

What is a Children's /Human rights mentor?

Children's /Human Rights Mentors share their knowledge of these rights with others so that they too can learn and experience more about these topics.

What is a practical assignment?

You practice yourself as a mentor. For this we organize together with you a small lecture (in the months after the workshop) in your school or youth club or where you would like to go - that's your choice. The lecture can also be held in teams.

There you share your knowledge about the children's and human rights in your age group (max. 20 minutes). You can talk about Children's /Human rights in general or you can select individual rights. And: We help you with the preparation and accompany you to the lecture.

Does the workshop cost money?

No - not for you.

What do I have to bring to the workshop?

Curiosity.

Can I get something in writing?

If you participated in the workshop and carried out the practical assignment, you will receive a certificate from us. This confirms that you have a special education. You can add it to your application for a job and it can be useful if you want to continue your social engagement.

What's next?

If you wish to continue to work as a Children's /Human rights mentor, we will gladly accept you as part of our Network for young mentors and request you for further lectures. And, about further possibilities we will inform you in the running process.
